The dates for Speed Week 2024 are 11th to the 15th March 2024. Entry Forms are now available for Speed Week 2024 and have been included with this newsletter.

The final day for pre-entries is the 26th February 2024, and after that time late entries will attract a \$350 late entry fee.

Note that there is now a 2 year cutoff for roll overs and those people that are rolling over their entry from 2022/23 will need to complete a 2024 entry form and indicate that it is a roll over.

Note, you will still have to pay your annual subscription. Thanks to all those people who have, this greatly helps the club and gives us increased confidence to commit our time and energy to making the DLRA the great club it is.

TECHNICAL

Bob's Bullshit...

Well, I managed to get two Speed Weeks in this year, Lake G and Bonneville, and should have been at Salar De Uyuni, Bolivia now for Reg Cooks world record attempt, which Reg had to unfortunately cancel for this year. Hoping to be at the NZ Land Speed event in December. Two Speed Weeks, and both shortened by bad weather. But we still managed to see records set at both tracks. The dedication of racers and staff, to hold a meet, is the same in both the USA and Australia. I am fortunate to be part of both the Aussie and US Land Speed families.

Electric Vehicles.

As some may know, I am on the SCTA EV committee, that was formed at the SCTA Speed Week 2023, and this year we had a long meeting to try and finalise a set of rules to present to the SCTA Rules committee. These have been finalised and go up before the rules committee next month. This EV committee's aim was to set out a rule structure for the existing, and future Electric Vehicle classes.

We are proposing 11 new classes and have decided on the rules that we are hoping to be included in the SCTA 2024 Rule Book. The old 1/E, 2/E, and 3/E classes are now split into Streamliner (EVS) and Lakester (EVL), still retaining the 1,2,3 weight break, as is in the new Rule Book.

I am currently seeking permission to let these new "proposed" rules available to DLRA.

Technical Inspection. (Cars).

This year we tried (again) to be as organised as possible. But we still have racers arriving at Inspection without having their paperwork, or not correctly filled out paperwork!

BEFORE lining up, Go to registration. Get your entry package, fill out the required sections, Including the event page in your logbook. If you don't do this, at the next event, you will be waived through, and sent to back of the line.

Please have your race car ready for inspection, and your push/recovery vehicle ready with all the required gear. There is a 35-page article on our DLRA website explaining what is required of you and your vehicle at inspection. Please read it.

Note: after 3:00 PM Sunday, Car Tech is done/closed. Late arrivals can still be looked at, subject to Inspectors being available, remember they are all racers too. So, if you arrive late, be prepared to wait a day or two to be inspected.

3.D.3 Arm/Leg Restraints

Please take note the wording on this rule has changed in our new rule book for 2024. Any restraint with welded parts, spring loaded "dog" clips etc, are banned.





The recommended/best Restraints are the DJ Safety/Deist part #605009.





Note the extra tri bar fitted below the adjuster, this is to help stop the restraint becoming loose from vibration and movement. You may still use other manufacturers restraints, But the hardware must be made of stamped or forged components, and still must have the extra tri bar fitted. The above restraints are available here in Australia from, Motorsport Connections, Sydney – Ph (02) 9838 7271, and in Melbourne, The Race Shop, (03) 9553 4200. I think cost is about \$75.00. They will last as long as you look after them, No recert is required. Helmets, All SA2010 helmets are now out of date, the current helmets are SA2015 (expire 1st Jan 2027), SA2020(expire 1st Jan 2032). Seat belts are Maximum 5 years, if in GOOD condition, it is recommended you change them at 3 years.

All other safety gear including suits, boots, gloves, head &neck restraint, do not require a recert, but must be in good clean, undamaged condition.

Frame Certification

The technical committee is looking to introduce certification of roll cages and frames for cars and streamliner bikes similar to what is done with SCTA vehicles and many other forms of motorsport. Look for more information on this in coming months.

JUNIOR LICENCING SYSTEM

In 2020 the club introduced a Junior Entrant Policy to cater for the increasing number of under 18 entrants wanting to compete at Speed Week. The purpose of this policy was to provide some consistency and clarity as to the requirements we need and to provide a progression or pathway as they gain experience.

This has proved to be a very successful and popular introduction to land speed racing. There is additional face to face training for Juniors over and above that of a normal Rookie. Each Junior will be assessed for their competency and skill level and an appropriate program set for them. For 2024 we will have a dedicated mentor at Speed Week to provide guidance and assistance for our Juniors.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS

Attention to all officials and volunteers, under South Australian law, anyone who has close contact with a person under 18 years of age should get a check. It is an offence to do child-related work without a Working with Children Check.

We ask you to then send us a copy of the certificate to the club for our records. It is a very simple process all you need is 100 points of identification, and the checks are free.

- signal words Danger or Warning 0
- hazard or precautionary statements such as Toxic if swallowed and Wear eye protection 0
- risk or safety phrases such as Harmful if swallowed and Keep out of the reach of children.
